Old Testament

Undergraduate Courses

- BOT - 111** **Old Testament Survey I** - 3 credits
A survey of the Old Testament through the Book of II Samuel.
- BOT - 121** **Old Testament Studies I** - 3 credits
A study of the first five Books of the Bible, looking at the origin of the earth through the development of humanity into the nation of Israel.
- BOT - 122** **Old Testament Survey II** - 3 credits
A survey of the Old Testament from I Kings through Malachi
- BOT - 230** **Old Testament Men and Women of Faith** - 3 credits
A study of the men and women of the Old Testament who were outstanding in their faith.
- BOT - 232** **Old Testament Studies II** - 3 credits
A study of the Historical Books of the Old Testament, from the Book of Joshua through Esther. The background and structure of each book is examined.
- BOT - 333** **Old Testament Studies III** - 3 credits
A study of the Old Testament Books of Poetry, covering Job through the Songs of Solomon. This study covers the background and content of each Book illuminating many key passages and doctrinal themes.
- BOT - 430** **Proverbs** - 3 credits
A study of the Book of Solomon, looking at the wisdom that God imparted to Solomon.
- BOT - 444** **Old Testament Studies IV** - 3 credits
A study of the major Prophets, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, and Daniel.
- BOT - 455** **Old Testament Studies V** - 3 credits
A study of the minor Prophets, Hosea through Malachi.

Graduate Level Courses

- GBOT - 500 Old Testament Survey - 4 credits**
An in-depth survey of the Old Testament.
- GBOT - 510 The Life of Moses - 3 credits**
An in-depth look at the Prophet and Law-giver.
- GBOT - 521 The Tabernacle of Moses - 3 credits**
A detailed look at the Tabernacle in the wilderness and its furnishings.
- GBOT - 532 The Tabernacle of David - 3 credits**
A detailed comparison of the Tabernacle of Moses to the Tabernacle of David.
- GBOT - 540 Psalms - 4 credits**
An in-depth look at the Book of Psalms.
- GBOT - 611 History of Israel I - 3 credits**
A study of Israel, its birth, development into a nation and subjugation as a nation.
- GBOT - 612 History of Israel II - 3 credits**
An in-depth study of the growth and decline of Israel.
- GBOT - 620 Pictures of Messiah - 3 credits**
A detailed look at the allegorical types of Messiah in the Old Testament.
- GBOT - 621 The Feasts of The LORD - 3 credits**
An allegorical and historical look at the Feasts of the LORD in their relation to Messiah.
- GBOT - 632 The Biblical Offerings - 3 credits**
An in-depth look at the Biblical offerings, including their pictorial types in relation to Messiah and their spiritual types.
- GBOT - 643 The Garments of the Priests - 3 credits**
A look at the garments of the Priesthood, including their relation to Messiah and their spiritual types.

New Testament

Undergraduate Courses

- BNT - 100** **New Testament Survey** - 3 credits
A survey of the New Testament from the silent years through the Book of Revelation.
- BNT - 110** **Between the Testaments** - 3 credits
A study of the background for the New Testament's Political and Cultural settings, defining how they impacted the New Testament peoples.
- BNT - 214** **The Gospels** - 3 credits
A study of the four Gospels, paying special attention to the style and approach of each writer.
- BNT - 215** **General Epistles** - 3 credits
A basic study of the General Epistles which includes James, I and II Peter, I, II, III John and Jude.
- BNT - 300** **The Book of Acts** - 3 credits
An overview of the Book of Acts, its key purpose, subjects and characters
- BNT - 311** **Pauline Epistles I** - 3 credits
A study of the Pauline Epistles from the Book of Galatians through II Thessalonians.
- BNT - 321** **Romans I** - 3 credits
A study of Paul's letter to the Romans, chapters one through eight.
- BNT - 325** **The Life of Christ** - 3 credits
A study of the Life of Christ, tracing His footsteps through the four Gospels.
- BNT - 331** **I Corinthians** - 3 credit
A study of the 1st Letter of Paul to the Corinthian Assembly. Topics included are, the Unity of the Church, Sexual purity, moral purity, Marriage Lord's Passover Meal, and Resurrection from the dead
- BNT - 332** **Romans II** - 3 credits
A study of the latter half of the Letter written by Paul to the Church at Rome, chapters nine through sixteen.
- BNT - 341** **Ephesians I** - 2 credits
A practical study of the first three chapters of Paul's letter to the Church at Ephesus with emphasis on practical and spiritual application
- BNT - 352** **Ephesians II** - 2 credits
A practical study of the last three chapters (4-6) of Paul's letter to the Ephesians.

- BNT - 420** **Jude** - 3 credits
A look at the Book of Jude
- BNT - 422** **Pauline Epistles II** - 3 credits
A study of I and II Corinthians, I and II Timothy, Titus and Philemon
- BNT - 430** **Hebrews** - 3 credits
A study of the Book of Hebrews, looking at the “Hall of Faith” and the role of Christ as Prophet, Priest, and King.
- BNT - 431** **II Corinthians** - 3 credits
A study of Paul’s second letter to the Corinthian Church continuing his discussion about issues that the Corinthian Church faced.
- BNT - 436** **The Life of Christ II** - 3 credits
A continued and more in-depth study of the Life of Christ, presented by the four Gospels and other Biblical data.
- BNT - 450** **Galatians** - 3 credits
This study looks at Paul’s letter to the Galatian Church. It includes a discussion on Paul’s Apostolic authority, and the Divine origin of his Gospel, Faith in God as a source of Justification, and our Liberty in Christ and Liberty vs. Legalism.
- BNT - 460** **Philippians** - 3 credits
This study looks at Paul’s letter to the Church at Philippi. It includes his admonition on unity, a discussion regarding Timothy, Legalism vs. Antinomianism and Thanksgiving.

Graduate Courses

- GBNT - 500** **The Acts of the Apostles** - 3 credits
An in-depth look at the Book of Acts
- GBNT - 501** **Ephesians** - 3 credits
This is a study of the Believer’s lifestyle from birth to maturity, covering the Believer’s position, conduct and stance against the enemy.
- GBNT - 506** **James** - 4 credits
An in-depth look at James, which looks at the use of the tongue and the wisdom of the Old Testament to First Century Believers.
- GBNT - 540** **The Letters of Peter** - 3 credits
An examination of the Letters of the Apostle Peter and his concerns about false doctrines
- GBNT - 550** **Reign of Grace** - 4 credits
A serious look at chapters 5 through 8 of Paul’s letter to the Roman Church, discussing covering the true meaning of redemption.

- GBNT - 560 Philippians and Colossians - 3 credits**
 Philippians is a look into Paul's personal spirituality and the peace that God gives Believers. Colossians is a look at the Lordship of Christ its parallel to Ephesians.
- GBNT - 570 Colossians - 3 credits**
 An in-depth study of Paul's letter to the Church at Colosse. This study takes an in-depth look at the basic elements of philosophy and their dangers, the preeminence of Christ, Redemption, the need to focus on things above, and the death of the Old man.
- GBNT - 580 Comprehensive Survey of the New Testament - 3 credits**
 A comprehensive look at the entire New Testament, piecing together the puzzle of redemption planned by God through the ages. This Course includes a study of political and religious backgrounds.
- GBNT - 590 Pastoral Epistles - 3 credits**
 This study gives the foundations for leadership within ministry. Paul's ancient advise is still relevant and necessary.
- GBNT - 630 The Sermon on the Mount - 4 credits**
 An in-depth study of the Sermon on the Mount and the teachings of Messiah. Topics include: Blessings, Commands, Devotions, Goals, and Warnings
- GBNT - 640 The Epistles of John - 3 credits**
 A look at the Letter of John to the Believing Churches, focusing on the love of God, and his warnings concerning false teachers.
- GBNT - 650 Hebrews - 3 credits**
 An extensive study of the Letter written to the Messianic Jews, demonstrating the pillars of Ancient Judaism with a comparison to the Book of Leviticus.

Biblical Culture

Undergraduate Courses

- BCU - 216 Bible History and Geography - 3 credits**
 A Geographical survey of the Biblical lands and history, examining Archeological discoveries
- BCU - 327 The Culture and Lifestyle of Biblical People - 3 credits**
 A study of the development of Biblical culture from the Old Testament through New Testament times
- BCU - 403 Tithing: Before, During and After The Law - 3 credits**
 A comprehensive look at the Biblical Tithe and its progression throughout the Old Testament. This study will demonstrate how the New Testament was impacted by the principles of Tithing established in the Old Testament.

BCU - 438 The Woman's Role - 3 credits
A look at Biblical women and the role they played throughout the Bible, also a look at her place, position and responsibilities within the body of Christ.

BCU - 449 The Mechanics of the Kingdom - 4 credits
What is, and when is the Kingdom of God? What are the mechanics of the Kingdom? This course reveals the truth about the Kingdom of God and the Kingdom of Heaven. Are the Kingdom of God and the Kingdom of Heaven the same thing?

Graduate Courses

GBCU - 516 The Culture of Biblical People and Lands - 3 credits
This study of the culture of Biblical peoples brings to light the activities of both Old and New Testament people.

GBCU - 627 The Jewishness of Jesus - 4 credits
A look at the Life and times surrounding Jesus, the Messiah and how He lived out the Old Testament. This study also looks at the Biblical Feasts and gives an allegorical view of Messiah.

Bible Prophecy

Undergraduate Courses

BPR - 333 Bible Prophecy I - 3 credits
This course is a foundational course dealing with the fundamentals of Biblical Prophecy and its interpretation.

BPR - 344 Bible Prophecy II - 3 credits
This course is a continuation of Bible Prophecy I. It takes a more in-depth look at Biblical Prophecy. This course focuses on the Prophet, the Prophetic Process and Jesus as a Prophet.

BPR - 455 Revelation Encounter - 3 credits
This course gives a solid introduction and overview of the contents the Book of Revelation.

Graduate Courses

GBPR - 567 Revelation and the Old Testament - 3 credits
This course explains the Book of Revelations extensive use of Old Testament, pictures, types and references from the Prophetic Books, such as Daniel and Ezekiel.

- BTH - 101** **Obedience** - 3 credits
A detailed look at obedience and obedient characters throughout the Bible
- BTH - 106** **Bible Doctrines** - 3 credits
An introduction and overview of basic Biblical Doctrine
- BTH - 121** **Systematic Theology I** - 3 credits
An introduction to Systematic Theology, starting with Bibliology and Basic Theology
- BTH - 232** **Systematic Theology II** - 3 credits
A continuation of Systematic Theology I, studying Angelology, Demonology, Anthropology and Christology
- BTH - 241** **Introduction To Bible Theology I** - 3 credits
An introduction to Biblical Theology and Bible Doctrine
- BTH - 252** **Introduction to Bible Theology II** - 3 credits
A continued study of Bible Theology
- BTH - 260** **The Fruit and Gifts of the Spirit** - 3 credits
An investigation of the Fruit of the Spirit of the Spirit and their impact upon the Believer.
- BTH - 270** **Holy Spirit** - 3 credits
A Biblical examination of the Person, works, Gifts and Ministry of the Holy Spirit
- BTH - 330** **Anointing** - 3 credits
A study on how to recognize, develop and release God's resident anointing through the Believer
- BTH - 341** **Spiritual Warfare I** - 3 credits
A study of the dimensions of Spiritual warfare and how to break the strongholds of the enemy. Also, covering the value of living the Spirit filled and controlled life.
- BTH - 343** **Systematic Theology III** - 3 credits
A study of Ecclesiology, Eschatology, Harmartology and Soteriology
- BTH - 351** **New Testament Church History I** - 3 credits
A study of Early New Testament history and its impact on modern civilization
- BTH - 362** **New Testament Church History II** - 3 credits
A study of Church History from Medieval Church to Modern Church

- BTH - 381 Christ Our Healer I - 3 credits**
An introduction to the healing ministry of Christ
- BTH - 442 Spiritual Warfare II - 3 credits**
A continued study of Spiritual Warfare I with a focus on understanding the enemy and his tactics. Also, covering the power inherent within the New Testament Believer.
- BTH - 492 Christ Our Healer II - 3 credits**
A continued look at Christ's healing ministry with emphasis on God's desire to heal the Believer.
- BTH - 490 The Blood Covenant - 3 credits**
An in-depth look at Blood Covenanting in the Bible with emphasis on the Blood Covenant of Jesus Christ
- BTH - 454 Systematic Theology IV - 3 credits**
A study of Pneumatology and Divine Healing
- BTH - 460 Hermeneutics - 3 credits**
An introduction to interpretation of Biblical text.

Graduate Courses

- GBTH - 590 Developing a Healing Ministry - 3 credits**
A study of the Believers Messianic Anointing and responsibility to continue the earthly ministry of Christ
- GBTH - 553 Spiritual Warfare III - 3 credits**
A more in-depth look at the tactics of the enemy, terminology, investigating witchcraft, and Satanism
- GBTH - 580 Righteousness - 3 credits**
An in-depth look at righteousness, its impartation and imputation to the Believer's account
- GBTH - 640 Covenants - 3 credits**
An in-depth look at the Eight major Covenants of the Bible from Eden to the Messianic New Covenant
- GBTH - 650 Apologetics - 3 credits**
A serious look at how to defend the faith
- GBTH - 665 Spiritual Warfare IV - 3 credits**
A look at how Jesus dealt with demonic spirits, demonic behavior, demonic attitudes, and deliverance.
- GBTH - 670 Hermeneutics - 3 credits**
An extensive study on Biblical interpretation, learning to apply Biblical Hermeneutics to Biblical text

Bible Language

Undergraduate Courses

- BLG - 211 Study Tools -3 credits**
Basic study tools for defining Biblical Greek and Hebrew words, a prerequisite to Biblical Greek and Hebrew courses
- BLG - 311 Introduction to Biblical Hebrew - 4 credits**
This study gives a very basic introduction to Biblical Hebrew starting with the alphabet and vowels.
- BLG - 321 Introduction to Biblical Greek - 3 credits**
This study gives a basic introduction to Biblical Greek, starting with the alphabet and basic and simple words.
- BLG - 422 Basic Biblical Hebrew - 3 credits**
A continuation of the Introduction to Biblical Hebrew, starting with basic and simple words and phrases.
- BLG - 432 Basic Biblical Greek - 3 credits**
A continued study of Biblical Greek looking at more complex words and grammar.

Graduate Courses

- GBLG - 522 Advanced Study Tools - 3 Credits**
An instructional guide for using advanced Lexicons and Theological Word books
- GBLG - 533 Advanced Hebrew - 4 credits**
An in-depth study of Biblical Hebrew

Christian Education

Undergraduate Courses

- CED - 101 Introduction to Computer Training - 3 credits**
This course is a simple overview of Computer skills.
- CED - 106 Office Skills –3 credits**
Basic Office skills such as Phone manners, receptionist requirements, and general office work.
- CED - 107 First Aid –3 credits**
This is a practical application course on basic First Aid needs and basic emergency procedures.
- CED - 111 Life Management I –3 credits**
This course deals with how to make proper decisions, the management of the soul, spirit, finances, and time.
- CED - 121 Spanish I –3 credits**
This course teaches the fundamentals of the Spanish language.
- CED - 122 Life Management God’s Way II –3 credits**
This course teaches the Believer how to set realistic Biblical goals and to develop a genuine Biblical vision, as well as managing their natural bodies.
- CED - 130 Introduction to Psychology - 3 credits**
This course is an introduction to the study of human behavior.
- CED - 140 Introduction to Sociology - 3 credits**
This course helps develop a Christian perspective on the nature of humans and the relationships that individuals form with other people.
- CED - 151 English I - 3 credits**
Rhetoric, grammar, and skills in communication.
- CED - 160 Audio Visual - 3 credits**
A hands-on study and practical use of audio and visual equipment. This course is a hands-on lab course.
- CED - 170 Study Skills - 3 credits**
How to study more effectively by developing positive study skills and habits, including research techniques and recourses.
- CED - 180 Health - 3 credits**
This course studies the basics of human health, including common health problems and basic health care.

- CED - 190 Reading Skills - 3 credits**
Learn to improve reading, memory, and comprehension skill.
- CED - 207 Business Math - 3 credits**
This course teaches the principles of Business math such as Bank Accounts, Profit and loss, Interest rates etc.
- CED - 211 Christian Education I - 3 credits**
An introduction to Christian Education - This course surveys the teaching methods of Jesus and demonstrates the need for Christian Education in the local Church.
- CED - 220 American History - 3 credits**
A study on the birth and development of America to the present day
- CED - 232 Spanish II - 3 credits**
A more in-depth study of the Spanish language
- CED - 240 Basic Sign Language - 3 credits**
This is an introductory level course on sign language.
- CED - 250 Introduction to Music and Drama - 3 credits**
This an introductory level course on Music and Drama.
- CED - 262 English II**
Writing skills, research work, and techniques
- CED - 270 World History - 3 credits**
This study covers world history from The Mesopotamian period to present day
- CED - 280 Time Management - 3 credits**
How to effectively manage and make the most of time
- CED - 320 Nutrition - 3 credits**
Learning basic skills in food sanitation, preparation and storage
- CED - 322 Christian Education II - 3 credits**
This course focuses on childhood education in the Church and the needs of children and teens.
- CED - 340 State Government - 3 credits**
This course covers the fundamental workings of state and local government.
- CED - 343 Spanish III - 3 credits**
Advanced Spanish and communication skills

- CED - 350 Federal Government - 3 credits**
This course gives a fundamental understanding of the Federal Government system.
- CED - 360 Finances and Money Management - 3 credits**
This course covers the basics of money handling, money management, including the basics of banking, investing, and financial planning.
- CED - 370 Principles of Christian Education - 3 credits**
A practical study of the principles and essentials of effective Biblical teaching.
- CED - 433 Christian Education III - 3 credits**
This course focuses on Adult education within the Church.

Graduate Courses

- CED - 544 Intentional Christianity - 3 credits**
This course focuses on educational needs within the Church, the Christian aim to reach the lost, and Christian mentoring.
- CED - 655 Science and the Bible - 3 credits**
This course takes an advanced look at the Bible pointing out scientific facts found in the Bible, demonstrating accuracy of the Bible, and resolving Biblical and scientific conflicts.

Administration

Undergraduate Courses

- ADM - 201 Ministry Administration - 3 credits**
A balanced approach to ministry business administration, using principles of good management in every facet of Ministerial administration.
- ADM - 210 Ministry Church Government - 3 credits**
A study of the various forms of Church Government.
- ADM - 305 Policy Setting - 3 credits**
Policy setting within Ministry and the Christian Environment.
- ADM - 307 Communication Facilitation - 3 credits**
This is a study on how to direct group discussion, how to run effective meetings, how to maintain a professional relationship while discussing various issues, and developing strategies for group participation.
- ADM - 311 Leadership in Ministry I - 3 credits**
A study in Ministerial leadership, including the responsibilities and obstacles of leadership, and learning the basic tenants of leadership.
- ADM - 422 Leadership in Ministry II - 3 credits**
This course is a study in practical issues of Ministry including why ministries fail, counseling, finances, and the dynamics of Christian Maturity.
- ADM - 430 Mentoring - 3 credits**
This course studies the art of self-perpetuation as modeled by Christ and developed by His Disciples.

Graduate Courses

- ADM - 533 Leadership in Ministry III - 3 credits**
This course teaches leaders how to develop a ministry leadership team, exercise group leadership skills, effective planning for growth, leadership methods and models.
- ADM - 620 Discipline and Correction - 3 credits**
A course on Biblical Discipline and Correction and how to have a Parental heart in ministry.
- ADM - 630 Accrediting Procedures - 4 credits**
A study in Accrediting Procedures for Christian Educational Facilities.
- ADM - 640 Developing a Non-Profit Ministry - 3 credits**
A study and research project on how to effectively develop a non-profit ministry, including the study of State and Federal Laws concerning such Ministries.

Bible Practical Application

Undergraduate Courses

- BPA - 111** **Foundations of Faith** - 3 credits
Includes Studies in Learning and also an introduction to Biblical Faith.
- BPA - 120** **Praise Life** - 3 credits
A study of the value of Praise throughout the Bible and providing insight into the importance of Praise.
- BPA - 131** **Prayer I - Necessity of Prayer** - 3 credits
A study on the types and necessity of Prayer.
- BPA - 222** **Faith II** - 3 credits
A continued and more in-depth look at Biblical Faith.
- BPA - 230** **Living Epistles** - 3 credits
This course teaches the Believer how to walk with God without succumbing to the “little foxes” that seek to destroy the Believer’s testimony.
- BPA - 240** **Preparation for Ministry I** - 3 credits
A study on the three (3) basics of Christian preparation for Ministry, including the Believer’s attitude, Motivational Giftings, and the Ministry of Helps.
- BPA - 250** **Armorbearer** - 3 credits
A study on the role and responsibilities of Armorbearers in the Body of Christ.
- BPA - 260** **Awareness of Church Government** - 3 credits
This is a study of the various types of Church government, such as the Presbyterian, Episcopalian, Congregational, and Independent.
- BPA - 333** **Nature of Faith (Faith III)** - 3 credits
This course teaches about the God kind of Faith.
- BPA - 342** **Prayer II - The Lord’s Prayer** - 3 credits
A study on the foundational principles of Prayer within the “Lord’s Prayer” (Matthew 6: 5-15)
- BPA - 350** **Integrity** - 3 credits
A look at Integrity and the Believer, stressing the importance of integrity in the Believer’s life.
- BPA - 360** **Ethics and Excellence** - 3 credits
A study of the importance of ethics and excellence in the Believer and Ministry.

- BPA - 370 Preparation for Homiletics - 3 credits**
A study on the art and skill of Biblical presentation and sermon building.
- BPA - 444 How to Grow in Faith (Faith IV) - 3 credits**
This course teaches the Believer to walk the path of genuine faith.
- BPA - 460 Preparation for Ministry II - 3 credits**
A study of the five-fold ministry.

Graduate Courses

- GBPA - 550 Methodologies for Pulpit Communication - 3 credits**
Teaching the Biblical expositor how to develop effective Pulpit communication skills.

An introductory level course on witnessing and effectively sharing the Gospel.
- MIS - 121 The “Call” of a Missionary - 3 credits**
The call, evaluation, and logistics for the missions minded.
- MIS - 222 Evangelism I - 3 credits**
How to effectively become a Christian witness.
- MIS - 230 World Geography - 3 credits**
This is a study of global geography.
- MIS - 232 Missions II - 3 credits**
History of Christian Missions and Biblical foundations for Missions.
- MIS - 333 Evangelism II - 3 credits**
A study of Evangelism for home and foreign field.
- MIS - 340 World Religions - 3 credits**
A study of world religions including false cults.
- MIS - 343 Missions III - 3 credits**
Trends and Phenomenon in Missions.
- MIS - 350 World Culture - 3 credits**
A study of world cultures and cultural preparedness for Missionaries.

- MIS - 360** **Dependency Syndrome and Missions** - 3 credits
A study on the causes and solutions concerning dependency on the mission field and other appropriate areas.
- MIS - 370** **The Missionary Responsibility of the Body of Christ** - 3 credits
Bringing the Body of Christ together with local Church Missions agencies to fulfill the Great Commission.
- MIS - 445** **Missions IV** - 3 credits
Cross-Cultural education.
- MIS - 450** **Missionary Finances** - 3 credits
Deputation and Fund Raising, Missionary Stewardship, Financial Management, how to build a Missionary portfolio, and Minister's taxes and compensation.
- MIS - 460** **The Lostness of Man** - 3 credits
A look at the depravity of mankind as the seed of Adam and his need for Salvation through the atoning work of Jesus Christ.

Graduate Courses

- GMIS - 500** **Planning Strategies for Evangelism** - 3 credits
This course is a team research project designed to facilitate the evangelism of an un-reached people group.
- GMIS - 544** **Evangelism III** - 3 credits
Evangelism, Church planting and growth, planning strategies, increase resources, and effective discipleship.
- GMIS - 556** **Missions V** - 3 credits
Missions Team building and Church planting.
- GMIS - 560** **Comparative Religions** - 3 credits
A study of the major Religions of the world and the truths of the Word of God that refute the claims of non-Christian religions.
- GMIS - 570** **Spiritual Conflict** - 3 credits
Missionary Apologetics, how to defend Christianity against world religions and cults.

Short Term Missions

Short Term Mission trips are made available through American Mission Teams and International Gospel Outreach.

Missions School - up to 39 credits

A two week Mission School consisting of 80 hours of lecture. The amount of credits given is determined by the amount of projects and assignments as signed and completed by the student over a period of a year following the lecture time.

Christian Counseling

Undergraduate Courses

- CCS - 101 Introduction to Christian Counseling - 3 credits**
This course addresses the local Church, the Christian counselor, and the Christian Community.
- CCS - 211 Biblical Counseling I - 3 credits**
This course introduces the Bible as the most valuable tool that can be used in Counseling.
- CCS - 221 Essentials of Marriage Counseling - 3 credits**
This course begins with premarital counseling and continues through problems that exist within marriage, taking a look at Biblical marriage models.
- CCS - 232 Christian Counseling and Women - 3 credits**
This course takes a close look at issues that deal specifically with women and problems they must face.
- CCS - 243 Christian Counseling and Men - 3 credits**
This course takes a close look at issues that deal specifically with men and problems they must face.
- CCS - 301 Counseling and Self-Control - 3 credits**
This course deals with the various personal issues that involve the need for personal control, discipline, such as anger, substance abuse and compulsory behavior. This course gives guidance for needful change.
- CCS - 322 Biblical Counseling II - 3 credits**
This is a continuation and expansion of Biblical Counseling I.
- CCS - 354 Family Counseling and Abuse - 3 credits**
This course deals with specific issues within the family structure, including various forms of abuse exist within the family such as child and spouse abuse.
- CCS - 365 Counseling Children and Adolescents - 3 credits**
This course deals with specific issues that involve children and adolescents in a contemporary society.
- CCS - 376 Counseling and the Young Adult - 3 credits**
Counseling Young Teens and Adults.
- CCS - 401 Grief and Crisis Counseling - 3 credits**
This course deals with marital issues such as abuse and divorce, rape, drugs, alcohol, old age, death, and the loss of a loved one.

- CCS - 420 Ethics and the Christian Counselor - 3 credits**
This course deals with ethical issues in counseling.
- CCS - 430 Pastoral Counseling - 3 credits**
This course looks at the local Church pastor as a Counselor. It deals with specific issues that challenge the local Pastor such as counseling and the local Church, congregational relationships, and Pastoral and congregational interaction.
- CCS - 440 Interpersonal Communications - 3 credits**
This course helps develop interpersonal and public communication skills, discussing basic communication theory and practice.
- CCS - 450 Counseling and Suffering - 3 credits**
This course deals with life's struggles and situations such as sickness, relational issues, pain, and how to handle these situations from a Biblical perspective.
- CCS - 460 Counseling and Personalities - 3 credits**
This course looks at the various personality traits and their combinations in counseling issues.

Graduate Courses

- GCCS - 520 Counseling, Psychology and the Christian - 3 credits**
This course studies the composite of the Christian with emphasis on the contrast between his mind, will, emotions and human spirit.
- GCCS - 540 Internship Counseling - 3 credits**
This is an advanced "hands on" study under the supervision of an experienced Licensed Counselor, for those who intend to pursue a career in Christian Counseling.
- GCCS - 580 Counseling for Spiritual Discipline - 3 credits**
This course teaches the Christian how to develop Spiritual disciplines, helping them to develop personal, organizational, and ministry disciplines.
- GCCS - 587 Counseling and Gerontology - 3 credits**
Counseling the mature and aged, in preparation for retirement and death.
- GCCS - 610 Counseling and Apologetics - 3 credits**
This course teaches the Christian Counselor how to deal with different worldviews and religious views in the counseling.
- GCCS - 620 Counseling, The Counseling Center and the Law - 3 credits**
This course deals with the legal aspects of Counseling and Counseling Center Management
